Dear Sheriff Bennett:

An early response to this letter would be appreciated.

On May 21 and 22, 2009, leaders of Constitutionally-based organizations concerned about escalating violations of the Constitution of The United States of America will be meeting at the Jekyll Island Club.

The purpose of the meeting is to help lay the groundwork for Continental Congress 2009, a peaceful national assembly of delegates, representing The People from each state, to discuss our Constitution and the future of our Nation. The date and location of CC 2009 is to be announced during this month's meeting at Jekyll Island.

Recently, the State of Missouri and the U.S Department of Homeland Security issued reports that refer to certain individuals and organizations as threats to law enforcement – that is, those who are concerned about the increasing disregard for the prohibitions, restrictions and mandates that the Constitution places on Government officials and who are expressing that concern. It is also noted that the Missouri report initially referred to those that support candidates for elected office that pledge their support for the Constitution, such as Congressman Ron Paul, former Congressman Bob Barr and Constitution Party candidate Chuck Baldwin.

We realize that much-needed communication between Homeland Security and The People caused a retraction of much of the information contained in the Missouri pamphlet, but even so, many feel there are continuing efforts to label patriotic Americans who want to uphold our Founding documents as a cause for concern.

Please know that those attending the meeting at Jekyll Island are individuals who not only have a passion for Constitutional governance carried out in decency and good order, but who are also committed to non-violent reform. We represent no threat to law enforcement.

With so many "Freedom Keepers" in one place, coupled with increasing anti-Constitution rhetoric, we find ourselves concerned about the safety of those participating in the meetings at Jekyll Island on May 21-22. It is a sad day for our Nation that this letter even needs to be written.

Are there any security measures you would recommend we employ or that would be employed by your Department? You and/or those you would send, would be welcome to attend any of the proceedings.
