I went to the office in missoula and had a really nice chat with Representative Rehbergs secretary, a man named Tom Schultz. In order to get the right reception I felt like I had to praise how awesome my Montana representatives are. They have not been fooled by the real ID act. That these papers are a formality and representative Rehberg is going to answer these petitions for redress flawlessly and come out looking FABULOUSLY!,, smelling like pretty flowers! I presented the papers as the representatives chance to dispell misconceptions! I did mention that all five hundred and some congressmen and representatives are supposed to be served these same papers and that it wasn't unusual considering that the people , We the people, are intentionally monitoring the performance of our representatives through this action. After our chat, and water cooler talk Tom very kindly walked me to my car and helped me load my children and reassured me that the representative is a decent guy. He also guessed that there would be no answer and that nothing would come of it.
